#### **Who Started Christmas?**

A few years back I heard a story on the radio of a woman who was out Christmas shopping with her two children. After many hours of looking at row after row of toys and everything else imaginable and after hours of hearing both her children asking for everything they saw on those many shelves, she finally made it to the elevator with her two kids. She was feeling what so many of us feel during the holiday season time of the year: overwhelming pressure to go to every party, every housewarming, taste all the holiday food and treats, financial strains, getting that perfect gift for every single person on our shopping list, making sure we don't forget anyone on our card list, and the pressure of making sure we respond to everyone who sent us a card. Finally, the elevator doors opened and there was already a crowd in the car. She pushed her way into the car and dragged her two kids in with her and all the bags of stuff. When the doors closed. She couldn't take it anymore and stated aloud, "Whoever started this whole Christmas thing should be found, strung up, and shot." From the back of the elevator everyone heard a quiet, calm voice respond, "Don't worry, ma'am, we already crucified him." For the rest of the trip down, the elevator was so quiet you could have heard a pin drop.

We feel this, don't we? It is so easy for us all to get caught up in the harried distraction of everything the season throws at us. So much so that we lose sight of the reason we have this season – a celebration of the birth of the one who came to save the world by showing us how much God loves us. As this season tries to push and pull you, don't forget to keep the One who "started this whole Christmas thing" in your every thought, deed, purchase, and word. If we all did that this Advent and Christmas season, think of how different this whole world would be every other day of the year.

### **Worship Ministries**

Join us this Advent season for *Words for the Beginning*, our worship theme & series. Advent is a season of endings and beginnings. As the calendar year comes to a close, a new church year rushes in. Christ's birth ushers us into new ways of living and loving— and yet, we feel the weight of many things coming to an end. The world as we know it spins madly on.



This series is filled with blessings, with the words we need to hear again and again as we begin a new season. Imagine the words Mary would speak to her newborn son. What scriptures and stories would she impart to him? What lessons would she teach him as he grew? And so, the weekly themes may feel like the lessons we teach to children, but in reality, these are lessons we continue to learn and relearn as adults. They may sound like the messages or homilies we impart to loved ones during special ceremonies or sacred rituals. We invite you to enter this Advent season as if you are entering a sacred new chapter, holding fast to the reminders that will bolster you for the journey ahead.

In many ways, pregnant Mary was surrounded by endings—large and small, personal and political. And yet, Mary proclaimed hope in a God who was and is making all things new. As we move through new personal and political chapters, may these words for the beginning renew us and remind us of the ways we are called to live out our faith. No matter what you are facing, no matter this new day brings, let love be your beginning.

Advent begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas Day and ends on Christmas Eve. It is a time of preparation and anticipation. The focus of the season is one of hope and the expectation of the coming of Christ. Symbols and rituals add depth and meaning to the season. One of those symbols is the Advent wreath.

A circular wreath of evergreens holding four candles is often used to count down the four weeks of Advent. The circular shape represents the eternal nature of God and reminds us that God's love has no beginning or end. The evergreen branches symbolize the hope of eternal life in Christ. And just as evergreen plants remain green even in the harshest of winter, the hope of salvation through Jesus endures in all seasons of life. The wreath as a whole reminds us of both the immortality of our souls and God's promise of everlasting life to us through Christ.



The candles on the wreath represent the light of Christ entering the world. One candle is

lit on the fourth Sunday before Christmas with another candle being lit each subsequent Sunday. The first candle pierces the darkness of the world. By the third candle, the light is winning out over the darkness. A fifth candle often is placed in the center of the wreath and lit on Christmas Day, celebrating the arrival of Jesus, the Light of the World.

Each week emphasizes a different theme. These themes correspond to the four candles on the wreath. The first week focuses on the hope of Christ's coming. The second signifies the peace that Christ brings to our lives. The third represents the joy that fills our hearts as we anticipate Jesus' arrival. The fourth reminds us of the unconditional love that God has for us, demonstrated through the gift of His firstborn son.

The Advent wreath serves as a visual representation of the journey towards the coming of Christ. As each candle is lit, the light increases, mirroring the increasing anticipation and joy of the season, inviting us to reflect on the themes of hope, peace, joy and love, and helping us to prepare our hearts and minds for the coming celebration of Christ's birth.

located in the entryway of St. Paul's. All donations will be shared with local shelters. Thank you!




