Focus Word/Phrase for 2026: SIT DOWN

Those who know me know that I do not make New Year's Resolutions. Instead, I choose a "focus word or phrase" for the year upcoming; a simple theme used to continue to develop the best version of myself that I can be as a disciple of Christ. Past foci have included GRATEFUL, MINDFULNESS, INTENTIONAL, KIND, FILLED, RELEARN, and 2025's Focus Word, GUAGES.

This year's focus word/theme: Sit Down.

I don't sit very well. This probably is not news to any of you. I like to keep moving and I like to stay busy. To quote King Julian from *Madagascar*: "I like to move it move it..." To be blunt: I am a human doing. I always have been. As a child, my Papa called me "Perpetual Motion" and my teachers all described me as having ants in my pants. ADHD would eventually be named in my young adulthood, but by then patterns were set and I was okay with those patterns.

I have never been able to sit still. And if I am honest, I have never really wanted to. Sitting requires patience and focus – things that I don't have time for because there is always something else to be doing. But in constant movement, things are missed... important things. You miss the meaning and depth and feelings behind the words of the story being told. Sometimes you even miss the whole story. You are so busy getting from one place to the other that you miss the beauty of the surroundings you are passing through. You are so fixated on the movement to the destination that you neglect the companions moving with you.

You can see in the previous statements that I realize that, in my rush to get everywhere, I know that I might miss everything that truly matters. I grasp the importance of taking in the surroundings and the value of the people I journey with. Why then is it so difficult – even scary – to slow down and sit down? I think Michele Capots answers this for me in her article, *The Sacred Art of Being Still*. "Truthfully, I avoided stillness because I was afraid to quiet my mind for fear of what I'd find out. What secrets my mind would reveal. I avoided it any way I could, always searching outside myself for the answers to life I was looking for."

She said the quiet part out loud. I am sure this is a big part of why I don't want to slow down and sit down. But I need to and I know it. A favorite confessional liturgy that I discovered decades ago still resonates with me, especially in light of what I have been writing:

You pursue me, Lord, you besiege me. I seek out the din for fear of hearing you, but in a moment of silence you slip through. I turn from the road, for I have caught sight of you, but at the end of the path you are there awaiting me. Where shall I hide? I meet you everywhere. Is it then impossible to escape you?

I am afraid to sit down and just be. What might the Holy Spirit say to me in that moment of silence? It is uncomfortable being alone with the thoughts in my head and the emotions in my heart. I like the surface of me – will I like the depth of me? But even more than that: aren't the people around me of value enough to just sit still with and be with? Why do I have to remind myself that they are worth pausing the journey for in order to sit with for a while? They, too, are tired and can use the rest. They, too, are busy and can use the stillness. They are worth a quiet sunset. They are worth a slow cup of coffee. And in getting to know them in that moment, I might just get to know me in this moment.

So yes, my focus phrase for this 2026 will be **Sit Down**. It will take intentionality. It will take effort. It will take discipline. It will take the year to maybe start to get it right. But I will sit down, and, using lyrics from the 1989 song by *James* with this focus phrase as its title, I invite you to join me:

Those who feel the breath of sadness - sit down next to me.

Those who find they're touched by madness - sit down next to me.

Those who find themselves ridiculous - sit down next to me.

In love, in fear, in hate, in tears - sit down next to me.

Epiphanaia is a Greek word meaning revelation or appearance. It underscores the importance of the day when Jesus was revealed as the savior of the world!


